**ORDER APPOINTING EXAMINING COMMITTEE**

On the petition of \_\_\_\_\_ (“petitioner”), to determine whether

FINDS as follows:

1. The following three persons shall comprise the committee to examine the alleged  
incapacitated person:

2. The committee shall examine the alleged incapacitated person in accordance with  
the standards set forth in Section 744.331, Florida Statutes. The examining committee shall  
determine the ability of the alleged incapacitated person to exercise those rights specified in  
Section 744.3215, Florida Statutes. Each member of the examining committee shall submit a  
written report within fifteen (15) days of the date of this order, confirming to the requirements of

Section 744.331(3)(f) and (g), Florida Statutes. The report must be filed with this Court within fifteen (15) days after the examiner's appointment and at least ten (10) days before the hearing on the petition and a copy of the report must be served on the petitioner and on the alleged incapacitated person by the clerk within three (3) days after the report is filed and at least ten (10) days before the hearing on the petition, unless waived.

3. The examining committee shall have access to, and may consider, previous examinations of the person, including but not limited to, habilitation plans, school records, and psychological and psycho-social reports.

4. All record custodians for any doctor, hospital, clinic, and medical authority shall release to the members of the medical examining committee for their examination and copying, if necessary, all records, data, information, or other medical documents concerning the alleged incapacitated person, including but not limited to records containing psychiatric, mental health, drug and alcohol use, and HIV information.

5. The Clerk shall serve a copy of this order on each examiner within three days from the date hereof.

6. Examining committee members are entitled to be paid upon presentment of invoice, even if presented prior to or as a prerequisite to the examination of the alleged incapacitated person.

7. An Order to Compensate Examining Committee Members shall be submitted to the court no later than fifteen (15) days from the filing of all examining committee reports.

8. Proof of payment made to the examining committee members shall be filed with the Court within sixty (60) days from the entry of the Order to Compensate Examining Committee Members. Proof of payment will only pertain to private pay cases.
