

**ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. :

**IN RE:           CRIMINAL - ORDERS - COMMUNITY CONTROLEES PARTICIPATING IN NONSECURE  
RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT**

---

Community Controlees attending nonsecure residential treatment must have written court approval prior to participating in Approved Offender Leave (furlough program) or Community Service Programs, per the Department of Corrections Nonsecure Residential Treatment Programs Manual. Accordingly, a written court order granting approval needs to be authorized.

IT IS ADJUDGED:

1. Community Controlees May Participate in Approved Offender Leave.

Community controlees may be granted permission to participate in approved offender leave provided they are in compliance of program rules and regulations, have the approval of the treatment provider and probation officer and are signed out by an approved sponsor. The goal of Approved Offender Leave is to motivate the offender towards self-improvement, to gradually re-integrate the offender back into the community, to strengthen family ties, to accustom the offender to self-reliance, and to expose the offender to beneficial programs and experiences.

2. Community Controlees May Participate in Community Service Programs.

Upon written court approval, community controlees may participate in community services projects to benefit local, non-profit service agencies or entities. Offenders with court ordered community service work will be given priority preference to work on any such endeavors.

This order shall take effect on MARCH 21, 1999.
